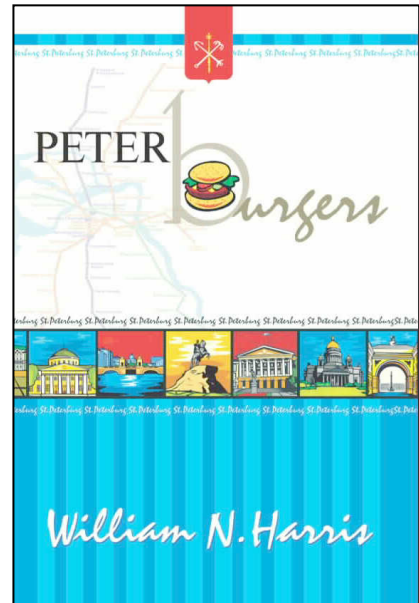


Give the gift of adventure.
